Wharekawa Marae November 2020 Wānanga

'E hoki koe ki tō ūkaipō, kia purea koe e te muri aroha.'

There is a buzz around Wharekawa Marae. Plans are in place and are starting to be actioned. We have initiated a staged approach to completing our whare tuupuna Paoa-Whanaunga. The Whakairo team under the lead of Puhi Thompson have started the maintenance mahi on the Mahau. Further work is planned and will progressively be carried out over the summer months.

Our Te Whakatutuki Plan (High Level) has been uploaded to our website, and we've now included our Environmental pou to ensure the redevelopment of the marae is conducted in ways that are harmonising and uplifting of the whenua upon which the marae stands.

November Wānanga The November wānanga focussed on Cultural Redevelopment ensuring our marae is rejuvenated as a meaningful 'cultural/tikanga space' of Ngāti Pāoa and Ngāti Whanaunga. Tikanga and kawa was the theme of the day, allowing time for whānau to reflect on the way things were and why we did them, to connect and bond and to kōrero. Discussions were had about the 'future' of technology in our Marae space and how that impacts on our tikanga and kawa.

Whānau also took advantage of the weather and participated in painting and touching up the intricate designs on the external kōwhaiwhai panels.

Whānau members harvested harakeke sourced from Mangatangi marae on 31st October, a huge acknowledgement, thankyou and shout out to our whānau at Managatangi marae. This will help launch our raranga journey from beginners to the more experienced weavers where we will gain deeper insights of the resource, its historical uses, techniques, sustainable practices, ringa toi, and tikanga practices.

It is all happening. Check out the Wananga dates and make yourselves available. Bring your whanau and take part in the uplifting of our Marae. Nau mai Haere mai.

Wharekawa 2120 Coastal Project

At the last Marae Meeting on the 8th November a presentation was given to Whānau by Frank Rawiri and Charles Royal with regards to a local initiative called 'Wharekawa 2120 Coastal Plan' – refer overview document on the Wharekawa Marae website.

In short Wharekawa 2120 is a project encompassing the Wharekawa Coast from Waharau to Pūkorokoro-Miranda, looking at sea level rise and the impact of flooding on our whenua and the resulting effects on our whānau.

The key considerations that need to be made are for us to look at our whānau lands and wahi tapu and how climate change is going to affect us and the discussions we as a whānau need to have.

More great news on promoting our Ngāti Paoatanga across Tāmaki. On Monday 9th November whānau were proud to be a part of the acknowledgement and recognition by the Auckland Central Precinct Properties CEO Scott Pritchard and his team.

Led by the NPIT there were three significant art installations, commissioned and produced by our own Chris Bailey (a renowned sculptor of Ngāti Paoa descent) for the Commercial Bay Building situated on the corner of Customs Street West and Albert Street, Auckland. These beautiful pieces commemorate the importance our lwi play in Auckland's landscape and seascape.

A Waiata ā ringa and Mōteatea were composed by Morehu Wilson and Mahuika Rawiri to recognise the mana of the occasion and the kapa haka notably led by Mahuika Rawiri, and karakia led by Hauauru Rawiri.
